

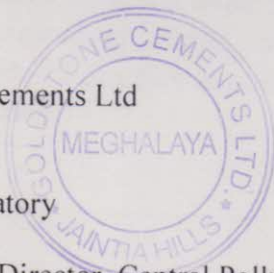

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SL. NO	CONDITIONS	COMPLIANCE
<b>A. SPECIFIC CONDITIONS</b>		
i	Continuous stack monitoring facilities to monitor gaseous emissions from all the stacks shall be provided. After expansion, limit of SPM shall be controlled within 50 mg/Nm <sup>3</sup> by installing adequate air pollution Control system. Electrostatic precipitators (ESP) to clinker cooler, bag house raw mill/kiln and bag filters to coal mill and cement mill. Low NOx burners should be provided to control NOx emissions	Online opacity meter is already installed in 2 stacks. Order has been placed for SO2 and NOX sensors and three other opacity meters have been placed and expected to be installed by June 30, 2017. Our plant is ready to meet with the new cement Industry standard, as applicable, e.g., 30 mg/Nm <sup>3</sup> for PM.
ii	Possibilities shall be explored for the proper and full utilization of gases generated from the kiln in waste heat recovery boiler (WHRB). A feasibility report shall be prepared and submitted to the ministry and its Regional office at Shillong within 03 months from the date of issue of the letter.	Hot gases generated from kiln are required for drying out moisture in Raw Meal and Fuel. Hence Klin waste heat is being utilized partially in Raw Mill and partially in Coal Mill to meet our operational requirement. Some heat is lost in clinker cooler.
iii	The National Ambient Air Quality Standards issued by the Ministry vide G.S.R. No. 826(E) dated 16 <sup>th</sup> November 2009 shall be followed.	The same is being followed during operation of plant. Ambient air quality monitoring is being done through 3 <sup>rd</sup> party (Recognized laboratory). Ambient air quality parameters are found to be within the limit for all the parameters.
iv	Secondary fugitive emission shall be controlled and shall be within the prescribed limits and regularly monitored. Guidelines / Code of practice issued by the CPCB in this regard should be followed.	All material transfer points are provided with Bag filters to control fugitive emission. Guideline / Code of practice issued by the CPCB is being followed during operation of plant. Regular monitoring for control of secondary fugitive emission under prescribed limit is being done.

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v	Effort shall be made to reduce impact of the transport of the raw materials and end products on the surrounding environment including agricultural land. All the raw materials including fly ash should be transported in the closed containers only and shall not be over loaded. The company shall have separate truck parking area. Vehicular emissions should be regularly monitored.	Provision is there for transportation of raw materials and finished product in closed containers. There is no any over loading in the trucks. Provision of regular water spray on haul roads and stock yard is being practiced. Treated water in DM Plant is reused fully for water suppression in haul roads. Company has planned for provision of separate truck parking yard.
vi	Total water requirement for cement and captive power plant shall not exceed 2,370 m <sup>3</sup> / day. All the treated wastewater shall be recycled and reused in the process and / or for dust suppression and green belt development and other plant related activities etc. No process wastewater shall be discharged outside the factory premises and 'Zero' discharge should be adopted	Total water requirement much below the stipulated limit as our Plant is totally close circuit arrangements for cooling water. Company has planned to adopt ZERO discharge of waste water. At present we are using about 48 m <sup>3</sup> /day.
vii	Efforts shall be made to make use of rain water harvested. If needed, capacity of the reservoir shall be enhanced to meet the maximum water requirement. Only balance water requirement shall be met from other sources.	Water harvesting scheme is under preparation, capacity of raw water reservoir is planned to use maximum water from the same. Daily fresh water requirement is being reduced.
viii	Regular monitoring of influent and effluent surface, sub-surface and ground water shall be ensured and treated wastewater should meet the norms prescribed by the State Pollution Control Board or described under the E(P) Act whichever are more stringent. Leachate study for the effluent generated and analysis shall also be regularly carried out and report submitted to the Ministry's Regional office at Shillong, SPCB and CPCB.	We are not generating any process effluent as the process water required for the cooling of bearing in cement plant is given treatment of cooling and sedimentation and entirely recycled. Effluent from DM plant is treated in a neutralization pit and treated water is reused entirely for dust suppression in haul roads. Subsurface water quality has been analyzed and report is submitted.

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ix	<p>All the bag filter dust, raw mill dust, coal dust, clinker dust and cement dust from pollution control devices shall be recycled and reused in the process and used for cement manufacturing. Spent oil and batteries shall be sold to authorized recyclers / re-processors only.</p>	<p>All the dust collected through pollution control equipment are either raw material or cement dust. Those are collected and recycled in a closed loop.</p>
x	<p>All the fly ash shall be utilized as per fly ash Notification, 1999 subsequently amended in 2003. xii	<p>An effort shall be made to use of high calorific hazardous waste in the cement kiln and necessary provision should be made accordingly.</p>	<p>Hazardous Waste generation in Meghalaya is bare minimum. However, Hazardous Waste are generated in other NE states like Assam may be available. Use of HW in the Kiln shall be explored.</p>
xiii	<p>As proposed, green belt shall be developed in at least 33% area in around the cement plant as per the CPCB guidelines to mitigate the effects of air emissions in consultation with local DFO.</p>	<p>Area has been selected to develop 33% green belt in and around the cement plant. Hills and CPCB, Regional Directorate, Shillong. 10 to 15 % of original forest covers falling within the boundary of the plant are protected.</p>
